Dear Parents and Associates

When I was at school the good Sisters who taught me instilled in me the Virtue of Humility! Much as all I always try to honour my education, today is not a day for humility! I am so exceptionally proud of the Graduating Class of 2022 and those who have nurtured them and educated them from birth. To have two First-in-State rankings is in itself worth abandoning my commitment to humility, but to also have students who have achieved two other State rankings, 167 Distinguished Achievements (from 67 students) and 7 All-rounders has given me great cause to express my unconditional admiration for the students and staff of St Vincent's College. It is worth remembering these Graduands completed two-thirds of their Preliminary year in Foxford mode and have battled surges of COVID (creating significant absence from school and similarly for their teachers) throughout 2022. Their final year saw them return to a style of teaching and collaboration with which they were no longer familiar. There are so many reasons to be proud of this cohort but first and foremost is, and will always be, what remarkable young people constitute the Class of 2022. Of course, this is the story of a group, but it is also the story of individuals who carried throughout their HSC journey extra burdens of ill health, grief, trauma, or disruption in their homes. These are the stories not necessarily told in "a measurement" such as those issued by NESA; they are however the stories carried with pride and affection in the hearts of parents and teachers, and I hope with great self-respect by the students themselves as they now transition to the next stage of their education. Education is a continuum and that is why we use a key as our metaphor rather than a trophy. A trophy is static, sits in a cabinet and has little usefulness. The key however is a metaphor for new beginnings, self-efficacy, empowerment, making things work. As our Graduands today celebrate their HSC results, I sincerely hope they believe they are leaving St Vincent's College with the keys for a happy, healthy and successful life. The Sisters of Charity highly value the concept of being "extensively useful" (of being able to contribute in a very meaningful way). I believe the Graduating Class of 2022 are ready to be extensively useful!

With my humility back in check, I express my sincere and profound appreciation to the students for their hard work and resilience in the face of challenge, our teachers for their professionalism and commitment to helping every student achieve their best and parents for loving and supporting their daughters throughout the trials and tribulations of the year. I also express my appreciation to Mr Robert Anderson (Director of Teaching and Learning), Heads of Department, Diverse Learning and Library staff for their academic care of the students. To Mrs Brooks (Deputy Principal) Mr Grace (Dean of Pastoral Students), the Heads of House, College Counsellor and Tutors for their pastoral care of the students.

Bonnie Joseph has been an outstanding student who excelled in her HSC studies and was awarded the Sr. Mildred Carroll Prize for English Advanced, Subject Prize in English Extension 1, The Mary Foley Memorial Prize for English Extension 2, the Subject Prize in Legal Studies, Subject Prize in Music, Subject Prize in Studies of Religion (1 unit) and the Shirley Jones Prize in Ancient History. Bonnie ranked 1st in the State for Ancient History and 3rd in the State for Advanced English. She achieved an outstanding ATAR of 99.55. It was indeed fitting that Bonnie was in Rome, deeply immersed in antiquities when she received her results.
