#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT TO THE AGM OF THE P&F

I use this annual report to express my appreciation to the P&F for their support of the College throughout 2023. The addition of the Art Show in March 2023 to the fundraising of the P&F provided great support to the Art Department and Lou's Place. The Spring Fair, Cocktail Party, Mothers and Fathers Dinners, Boarder Parent Association Weekend in orange were major highlights. The generous financial support for the installation of permanent sound in the Caritas Christi courtyard will be extremely useful for many College and Parent Functions. The contribution of the P&F to Staff and Student initiatives, Formation for Parents and the Scholarship fund are recorded in this report with appreciation.

2023 was the 165th year of the College and a time for celebration and appreciation. We dealt with our history through the restoration of Heritage Buildings (Chapel and Aikenhead Buildings) and prepared for the future by submitting a DA for the building of Stage 2 of the Master Plan – multi purpose gym/hall, indoor pool, roof-top courts and new and refurbished spaces for Music and Drama.

The introduction of 2023 of Deans of Early, Middle and Senior Secondary was well accepted by students and strong identity for each Stage was created. The retention of the House Co-ordinator role, Vertical Tutor Time helped create continuity in the midst of change. The College is now fully accredited as a Visible Wellbeing Partner School.

The Inaugural Broken Hill Endeavouring was a very positive experience for the Year 9 students, and it is hoped this will become an annual event to supplement the Outdoor Education Program in Years 7, 8 10 and Retreats in Years 11 and 12.

The HSC results for 2023 were highly commendable with strong ATARS, and high percentage first and early offers. The graduating Class of 2023 are well prepared for their post-school lives.

In conclusion, I thank Leisha Major, Lisa Hunter, Trisha Rubenstein and Elena Ferrari for their strong leadership of the P&F, and a recognition of wonderful role that parents play in the lives of their daughters.
