Our priority is student safety, healthy relationships and positive learning. Research has revealed there's a need to better regulate phone usage in and out of class because:

- Present experience in using apps on phones varies across subjects and ages.
- Phones can have a negative impact on playground dynamics
- Phones cause distractions, compromising safety (distracted pedestrians) and in some instances harm (relationships)
- Phones can compromise resilience/problem solving
- Parents and Educators worry about addiction and lack of self-regulation of teenagers
- Educating and regulation of phone usage is essential: protocols, educational enablers, risks.
