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FAITH

Cherish our Catholic Heritage

The Sisters of Charity were founded by Mary Aikenhead. As a young women in Ireland in 1815 she worked amongst the poor in Ireland and in established the Sisters of Charity. In 1838 their mission extended to Australia where they began helping those in need, especially the convict women of Parramatta. They were the first female religious order to arrive in colonial Sydney, the Sisters cared for the poor and marginalised. Those early ministries have developed into world-class services in health, education and community care.

On May 11858, the Sisters of Charity founded St Vincent's School on its present site in Potts Point as a co-educational primary school. It became a College in May 1882. The Sisters of Charity believed in the value of a girl's education and the strength of a Catholic Faith life supporting the growth of the individual.

From the first year, students at St Vincent's College were prepared for external examinations. In early years, music figured largely in the curriculum. At the beginning of the twentieth century, it was reported that St Vincent's College "was already on a firm footing, having won respect for its academic and musical successes, but still more for the character training and formation of its students."

St Vincent's College continues to provide a high standard of education encouraging excellence, critical inquiry, independence in learning and above all, commitment to truth and personal integrity. As a Catholic College, we are committed to establishing a community which is energised by the life and teachings of Christ. St Vincent's College aims to be a place where Gospel values are lived and where the Ignatian ideals of Compassion, Commitment and Competence are visible. Social justice has always been at the forefront of College practices and policies.





The key to our pastoral approach is developing the whole person within a wellbeing framework. St Vincent's College prides itself on the role staff and our community play in shaping our students to be confident, independent and discerning young women. Students are encouraged to take responsibility for their actions to maintain a positive environment for wellbeing and learning. Pastoral and academic care programs challenge and nurture students to develop personal capability to be agents of their own wellbeing and academic success.


House and Tutor Group

Pastoral Care at St Vincent's College is structured in a vertical House system with a Tutor Group being the central focus. This enables continuity of care and communication with families and allows peer relationships to grow and transition as student progress through the years within the same Tutor group.

Tutor Groups meet each morning, enabling the interaction of students and teachers in small personalised groups, where each student is known, valued and affirmed.

Within the Tutor system each student is encouraged and guided academically and personally by their Tutor teacher. The depth of communication between the varying Year levels is further enhanced by the peer support within the Tutor Group and House.

The College House system establishes a shared leadership and team model, whereby the pastoral and academic lives of students are integrated. Importantly the House system enhances the infusion of College values.





Each House Group has a Head of House who facilitates strong relationships between staff, students and parents in the care and support of the girls. The Pastoral Care Team leads the development, implementation and evaluation of pastoral care programs that are evidence based and responsive to adolescent girls in the context of their contemporary world.

The College House system uses the vertical House as the unit around which all the pastoral and administrative functions revolve. This reflects the College's commitment to holistic education, whilst also enabling students to develop relationships amongst their peers within and beyond their Year cohort.

Belonging to a House generates joy, spirit and pride that is celebrated across school life.

The College House names honour the rich tradition of the five Sisters of Charity who began the work of the Sisters in Australia and Mary Aikenhead who is the inspiration for their work, providing a fitting model of intelligence and compassion for our students.

Our boarders are drawn predominantly from rural NSW regions and towns, some interstate and overseas. Together they bring a rich and diverse variety of life experiences and cultural backgrounds. They are welcomed into a community that fosters and values relationships built on respect, mutuality and inclusivity. When they enter boarding at St Vincent's College they create friendships that last a lifetime.

For boarders from regional areas, our College's location offers boarders the unique experience of a quiet oasis of College life only minutes from the centre of Sydney. The modern spacious facilities of the Boarding House provides all the comforts for our boarding students to establish a sense of belonging to our warm community. Boarding provides opportunities to develop independence, responsibilities to themselves and others, the ability to share space and facilities, resilience and to develop their relationship with God through personal and communal encounters, all in a caring and supportive environment.

At St Vincent's College, our rich heritage and unique location translates into a strong grounding in social justice is instilled into every aspect of daily life. Students have the opportunity to participate in a wide array of Social Justice initiatives and to take part in immersion and service learning programs.

Ignatian Spirituality calls for people to come to understand themselves and their place in their world through a process of Context, Experience, Reflection, Action and Evaluation. As a College whose mission is formed in Ignatian spiritualty through the rich tradition of the Sisters of Charity, we take great pride in offering an array of Social Justice experiences and Immersions for students to engage in so that they may become the people God dreamt them to be. All of our service, immersion and advocacy programs offer participants opportunities to deepen their spirituality and strengthen their commitment to living their faith in ways that build a more just world.

Social Justice in our College is based on the Ignatian way of proceeding: reflection, experience and action. Throughout their time at the College, all students engage in Social Justice. Every student is provided the opportunity to engage in raising awareness for a number of charitable organisations that the College is affiliated with. These opportunities are facilitated at House and Year levels. Students are expected to learn about the agency they support and become advocates for its cause. Students develop their communication and leadership skills whilst deepening understanding of inequities and injustices that exist at a local, national and international.



CO-CURRICULAR

Fostering creativity, celebrating diversity

St Vincent's College recognises our students as individuals and encourages exploration of their unique expression outside the realms of the traditional classroom. There is plenty to choose from and students are encouraged to participate, discover, celebrate their talents and share their generous spirit through participation in co-curricular opportunities, enhancing their creativity, leadership, well-being, resilience and teamwork skills.

Our students enjoy the benefits of an exciting and extensive co-curricular program that caters to their diverse talents and interests nurturing mind, body and spirit to build individual confidence and self-esteem.

Students can participate in classes such as dance, drama, debating, public speaking, choral and instrumental music, the Mock Trial competition and the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. The Marion Corless Learning Resources Centre also facilitates a range of Clubs around literature, writing, reading, popular culture and gaming.

Music and Dance ensembles are facilitated and taught for a nominal charge to support the Colleges policy of inclusion. Every student is welcomed, supported and nurtured. Creating and performing, even in front of like-minded individuals requires bravery, and develops confident, creative, independent young women.





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


Sport is an integral part of College life with individual and team sports with the College Sport program attracting high levels of participation by all students. Students are encouraged to choose at least one team or individual sport each term from an extensive range of options including basketball, netball, hockey, softball, crickey, volleyball, touch, soccer, futsal, water polo, athletics, cross country and swimming. The College participates in a number of different sporting competitions run by various sporting associations and our girls enjoy considerable success in the Independent Girls Secondary Schools (IGSSA) Association competitions and carnivals.

The value and significance of outdoor education is recognised and students are provided opportunities to engage in physical and team building skills. Annual camps are enjoyed by students in Years 7 to 10, with senior students undertaking retreats that strengthen their relationship with God and friends.











COLLEGE LOCATION



St Vincent's College offers a unique opportunity for girls to be educated in an historical education precinct on the very edge of one of the world's major cities. The cosmopolitan atmosphere of Potts Point provides a rich, real world experience in which the students develop skills, confidence and awareness. The vibrant streetscape of the area allows the students to appreciate the culture, history and duality of this area of Sydney.

Sydney's impressive harbour and sky-line provide a stunning outlook for our students to enjoy, and within an easy walk are major landmarks and cultural facilities such as Government House, the Sydney Opera House, The Art Gallery of NSW, the State Library and the Royal Botanic Gardens.

Public transport services in Potts Point are excellent with trains and buses linking Potts Point to central transport hubs of Sydney. Our students develop great capacity to plan their travel, and the travel to and from a chance to socialize with students from our own and other Colleges.

For our Boarding families the proximity of the Airport is a bonus; we are also served by Country Link Buses.
