Grace Robinson Prize Highest ATAR 2021

The Grace Robinson Prize is named after a very early graduate of St Vincent's College. Grace was one of the very earliest women to graduate from Medicine at the University of Sydney and pioneered the way for generations of women to follow. It is very appropriate that this year the Grace Robinson Prize goes to Maddison Neill who will now enrol at the University of Sydney to study Science with Advanced Studies (including Mathematical Science) and possibly Medicine in the future. Maddison has been a distinguished scholar throughout her time at St Vincent's and in her final year at the College was the recipient of the Subject Award for Biology, and Subject Prizes for Italian Beginners, Mathematics Extension I, PD/H/PE and Studies of Religion I. In a quite remarkable achievement Maddison achieved three State rankings - third in PD/H/PE, third in Italian Beginners and eighth in Biology. The entire community is immensely proud of Maddison, who despite this abundant academic talent, was always unassuming, generous and exceptionally hard working. Maddison will also leave behind her at St Vincent's a legacy of achievements in the Swimming Pool and on the Netball courts. Like the name sake of this award, we believe Maddison will make an exceptional contribution in all her professional pursuits. Congratulations Maddison.
